- Anth 529**                    **Seminar in Ethnography** [new course] This graduate seminar examines a variety of methodological, stylistic and craft issues in the process and product of ethnography.
- Biol 537/MBioS 537** **Plant Cell Biology** [new course, cross listed with MbioS 537] Structure and function of plant cells with emphasis on current research; topics include membrane biology, protein targeting and molecular signaling.
- C E 567**                    **Advanced Characterization of Highway Materials** [add coop/w Uoff-jointly taught] Basic and advanced level of the fundamentals of material response to static and repeated loading; emphasis on the deformation and fatigue behavior of asphalt mixtures.
- C E 591**                    **Aerosol Dynamics and Chemistry** [new course] Chemical and physical properties of atmospheric aerosols. Sources, sinks and transformation processes.
- Com 507**                    **Communication Ethics Seminar** [new course] Special topics in communication ethics.
- Com 524**                    **Intercultural/International Communications and Social Change** [new course] This course examines application of communication theory, research and technologies aimed at fostering social change in intercultural and international contexts.
- Com 526**                    **Current Topics in Intercultural Communication** [new course repeat cum max 6 credits] This course covers topics in current intercultural communication research. The specific topics and materials discussed each semester the course is offered will be determined by the instructor of record. The instructor will change to provide the students with exposure to different faculty members and their expertise in the areas of intercultural communication.
- Com 535**                    **Organizational Communication Theory** [new course] Traditional and emerging theories of organizational communication.
- Com 537**                    **Organization and Society** [new course] To explore the historical foundations, theoretical developments, contemporary issues, and

the practical implications of communicative processes of organizations within society.
